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The Message of Easter Revd Gareth Lane (Vicar for Berryfields)



As I write this Easter message the media is awash with news of the devastating earthquake in Turkey and Syria. The pictures and stories coming out are hard to comprehend with more than 35,000 people having been killed and many more thousands suffering life-changing injuries. With so many buildings destroyed or unsafe, people have been left out in the freezing cold. Many have lost everything - their homes and loved ones - and are now exposed to harsh weather conditions. The cry and prayers around the world are "God where are you in all this?" The Bible though never seems to give us an easy answer to that timeless question. However, what we do see within it's pages is that God has always been in the midst of our pain and suffering.

"For God so loved the World that he gave his only son..."

John 3:16

When Jesus lived on Earth 2000 years ago, he spent much of his life and teachings showing us how to live and how to care for one another, despite our difficulties and differences. The Easter drama that unfolded at the end of Jesus' life was in some respects about him showing us how he went through pain and suffering to put the love of the whole of humankind above himself. For many he is a role model, and many try to follow as he taught, looking out for one another, and putting other's interests above that of their own.



Without the events of that first Easter week, we would simply be remembering Jesus as a great teacher, a charismatic wonder-working holy man, or maybe a failed revolutionary whose memory was kept alive by a few disappointed followers. However, the Bible places Jesus' suffering, death and subsequent

resurrection as the pinnacle, the high point for the Christian faith. As we're munching on our chocolate eggs, which represent new life, we could also consider the amazing events which took place 2000 years ago and how one man put the love of humankind above that of himself. May that in turn cause us to donate generously towards the humanitarian relief effort going on in Turkey/Syria.

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Whatever the weather, there is always a warm, friendly welcome awaiting parents/carers at Little Berries, the Berryfields Baby and Toddler Group.

We meet every Thursday morning during term-time at Roman Park Hall.

Mums, Dads, Grandparents, carers and childminders all gather each week with bumps, babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers to play with a huge variety of toys. 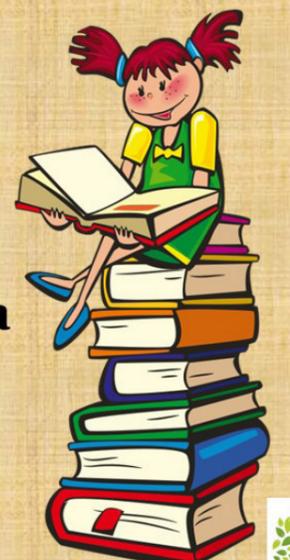

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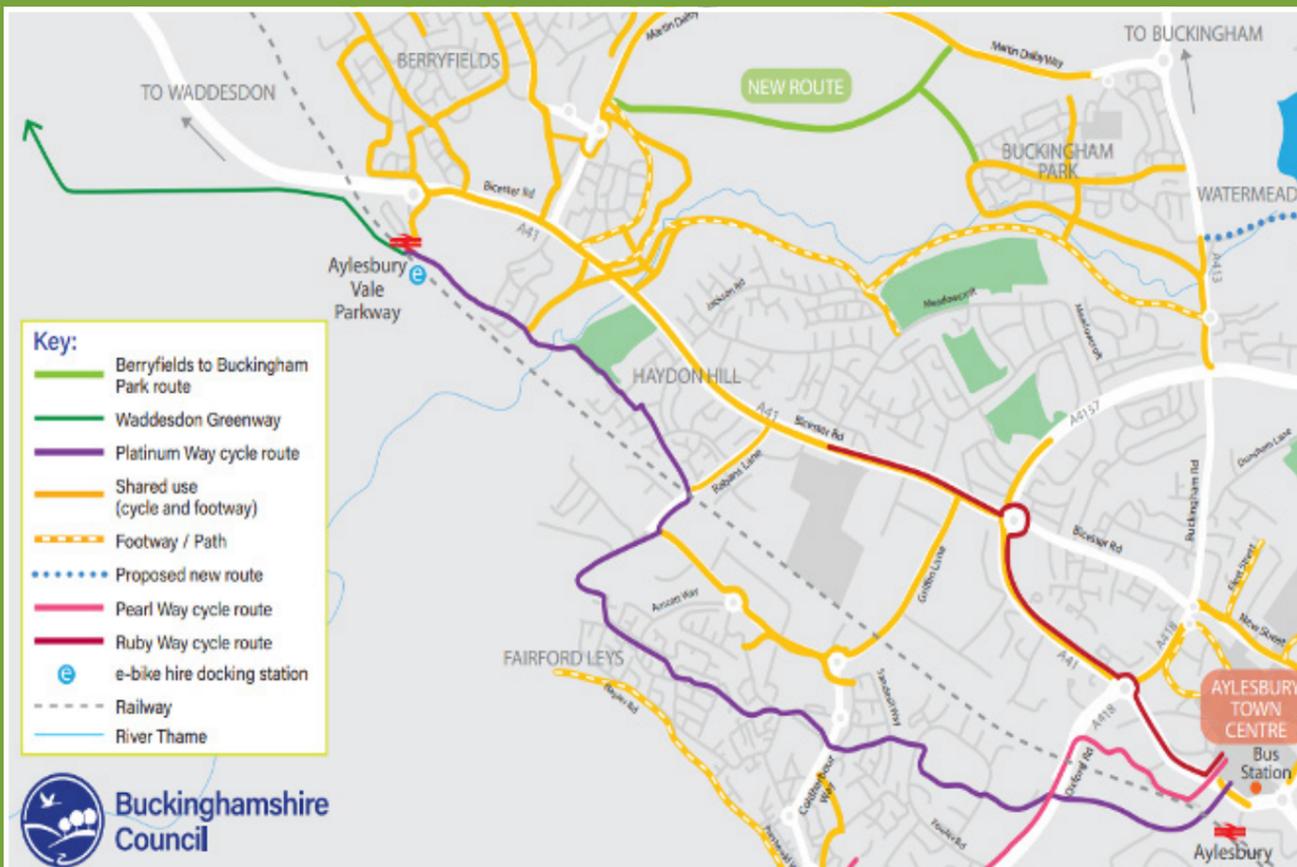


St Peter's Greenway

A new 1.7km route that opened in October 2022 and is a complete traffic surfaced greenway between Berryfields and Buckingham Park- linking to Aylesbury Vale Parkway, Waddesdon Greenway, Waddesdon and the Manor. The route is already proving to be popular amongst local residents/communities.

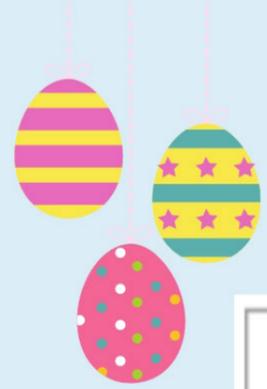

The Aylesbury Vale Academy is a large, non-selective all-through school thriving at the heart of Berryfields community and educating over 1800 students. Our unique status means that we educate children from two to eighteen. As Berryfields has grown so have we in our state-of-the-art building with fantastic indoor spaces and sporting facilities. We place significant importance on academic excellence but value, just as highly, the wide range of experiences learners can access. 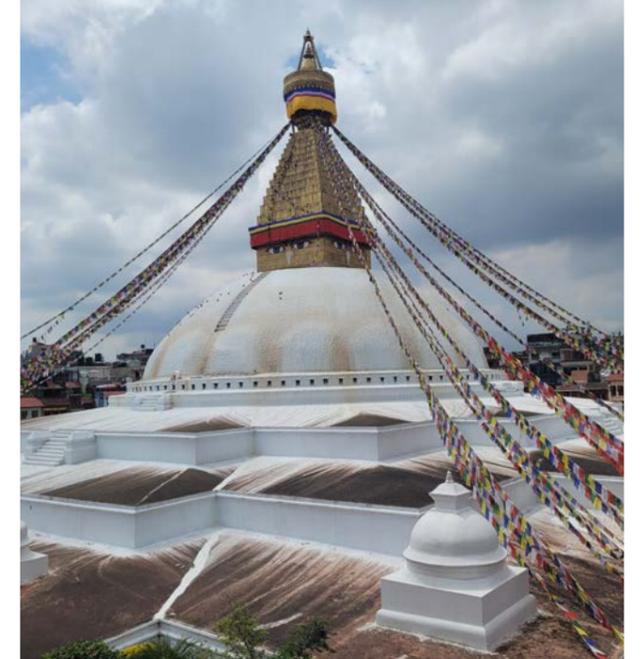

AVA's trip to Nepal by Annabel Hyland and Zoe Kaenzig

When we heard about an amazing opportunity to visit Nepal with World Challenge. The idea behind the trip is for students to go on an adventure of a lifetime while supporting the country's economy through sustainable tourism and community projects. Although the cost of the trip was very expensive, our group came together to fundraise by doing activities such as car washes, movie nights, and bake sales.

We certainly had a culture shock when we first arrived in the bustling streets of Kathmandu, but we soon adapted to the way of life and greeted everyone we met with "Namaste". Our first stop was the monkey temple where we learnt about the local culture. We hiked to the world peace stupa, took an eight-hour bus journey to Pokhara, stopping halfway to do white water rafting. The final stop on the trip was our homestay community project where we stayed with local families. We ate with them, helped them with farming and truly experienced the Nepalese way of life. It was an experience we will treasure forever. We all came away from the trip having learned so much. A whole new culture and way of life, the joy of travelling and new experiences but most importantly a reminder of what is important in life- we didn't have our computer games, our TVs or fancy clothes and we certainly didn't miss them.



World Challenge 2024

AVA is excited to offer World Challenge again in 2024 after a successful trip to Nepal in 2022. In 2024 we aim to go to Malaysia, which is a once in a lifetime trip for many of our students.

These trips offer great life experiences such as doing marine conservation with turtles, hiking in the Emerald Cameron Highland and doing work with local communities. But the most impressive thing about the World Challenge is the ethos...

World Challenge endeavours to leave as little carbon footprint in the world as possible, and actively tries to offset the net balance to the environment on the trip by helping nature and the communities in which are hosting us. But by far my favourite aspect of World Challenge is the resilience, aspiration and independence that World challenge fosters. World Challenge encourages students to make this money their own way, by getting a job, organising crowd funding events such as selling sweets, cake ales, car washes, in 2022 a student even opened up an online croquet business and got great success.



It would be amazing if the community could support these students by supporting them in their endeavours by allow students to buy from events and coming down to lend your support where you can. Aylesbury Vale's Academy winter production of *The Static* took place on the 7th and 8th December 2022. This was a challenging production which the students embraced and worked extremely hard towards. Over the 2 nights the cast delivered a professional and slick performance of the coming-of-age story about desire, guilt and mind over matter. School Governors' who attended remarked on how everyone's hard work was obvious, in the way everything hung together. So much for the students to learn, the stagecraft and movement was great in what was a challenging play in terms of content and demands on the performers.

We have so many talented students here at AVA who are passionate about music and drama and who regularly perform concerts, and productions. The Performing Arts department is always supported well by the school and the local community, and we look forward to more exciting events later this academic year including a summer festival.

Pre-School Section

The Aylesbury Vale Academy Preschool delivers high quality education and care to our community of 2-4-year-olds that is evidence-based and informed by child development research to create developmentally appropriate, play-centred experiences. Our pedagogy is firmly set within an understanding of play as a vehicle for learning and leads the development of a child-focused, communication-friendly environment in which adults are constantly extending and challenging children's skills and thought processes. Our planning seeks to incorporate children's current ideas and fascinations, key events linked to children's cultures and religions, alongside flexible themes and open-ended 'invitations to play'. We are keen to instil a love of reading in our young children and so books form the basis of much of our provision, integrating classic favourites alongside modern texts which reflect and celebrate the diverse nature of our community.

At the AVA Preschool, children are also supported to build independence to grow into adventurous, courageous and resilient individuals as they establish a sense of self and are empowered to assert their own autonomy. Staff respond to each child's emerging needs and interests, guiding their development through warm, collaborative interactions. Every child is assigned a member of Preschool staff as a Key Carer to support them to build strong attachments and facilitate 'expert knowledge' of children's skills and needs. We have a highly experienced and knowledgeable team of Key Carers who know the children inside out and who are a vital element in making our Preschool a place where children feel safe, valued and inspired.

Who is Integrative Counselling for?

It is a common misconception that Counselling is only for navigating through a traumatic or emotional life event. In fact, most of my clients come to therapy to get to know themselves better and understand why they react to things in life the way they do! Who we think we are and how others see us is not always the same thing and this can be confusing? We can find ourselves struggling in relationships with friends, family or our partners leaving us feeling frustrated. It can be lonely to be in relationships where you do not feel heard, understood, or appreciated. This can lead to anxiety, depression, or a loss in confidence.



Therapy is a great place to talk about these experiences and start to make sense of what is happening. Our behavioral patterns and beliefs develop through life and don't always change when the environment we are in is changing. Counselling offers a safe, non-judgmental space to unpack some of these situations and look at them from different perspectives. You can start to explore how your thoughts influence you and lead you to conclusions about things based on past experiences rather than the facts in front of you. Many of us don't notice the negative dialogue that runs in our heads or stories we tell ourselves about certain situations. This can be what leads us to repetitive arguments or conflicts where feelings and emotions can escalate rapidly and sometimes feel out of proportion.

Everyone is aware of the benefits of exercise and healthy diet, but not many think about the benefit of regularly looking after our mental health. Just like our bodies, our minds need exercising and a bit of an overhaul now and then. Therapy can provide a space to do this and help us develop new tools and life skills. When we can identify different choices in how to communicate or respond we feel more relaxed and in control of our lives. It teaches us that we can't control others, but we can control how we react and the impact of that reaction on our mental wellbeing.

Integrative Counselling is for anyone who feels stuck, discontent or who is simply curious about their life. It provides a space for growth and reflection. It can help us get through unresolved traumatic experiences as well as help make sense of the world around us. You do not have to commit to weekly sessions, although to start with weekly is often helpful to establish a trusting connection with your therapist. Sessions are more accessible these days with most therapists offering the option of online appointments as well as in person. If you are interested in finding out more about Integrative Counselling, please get in touch and I will be happy to assist you in starting your own therapeutic journey.
